The Impact Bioenergy® team has been hard at work to bring fully digested food scraps back to where they belong ... in the soil to complete the miraculous circular economy of nutrients, energy, water, carbon and organic matter. Soil has a hunger for organic matter which is the best slow-release nutrient engine when feeding the microbiome. We start with commercial kitchen trimmings, post-consumer food scraps, food and beverage residuals (spent ingredients like yeast, soybean pulp, whey, etc.). Then we create an emulsified smoothie that becomes the feedstock for microbial digestion. After fermenting the smoothie and harvesting biogas, the digested emulsion is dried and milled. The final product is a special formulation of digested food, fish bone meal, poultry feather meal, mealworm manure, and wood biochar.
